The coronation was held on May 12. The candidates and their escorts were introduced by yearbook editor Krista Robinson and yearbook member Dusty Elder.

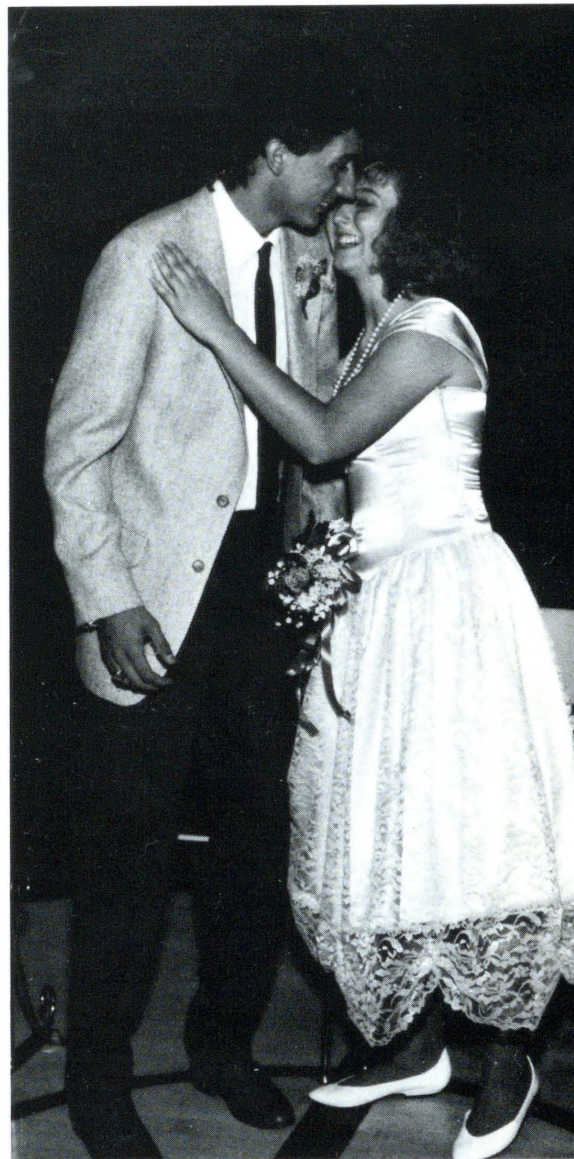
The candidates were selected in March of the current year by the yearbook staff. The individual classes then made the final selection for the king

This year's theme was the Best of Times.







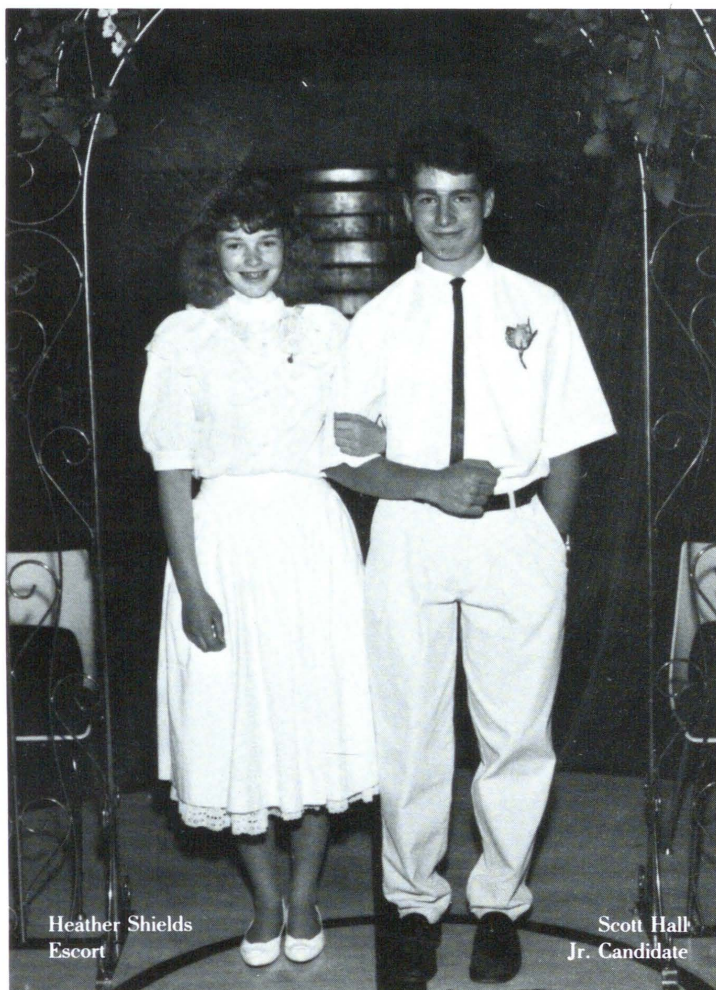

Joy also took part in the Granby and Stella Christmas parades. Jon Stouffer drove the car that Joy rode in.

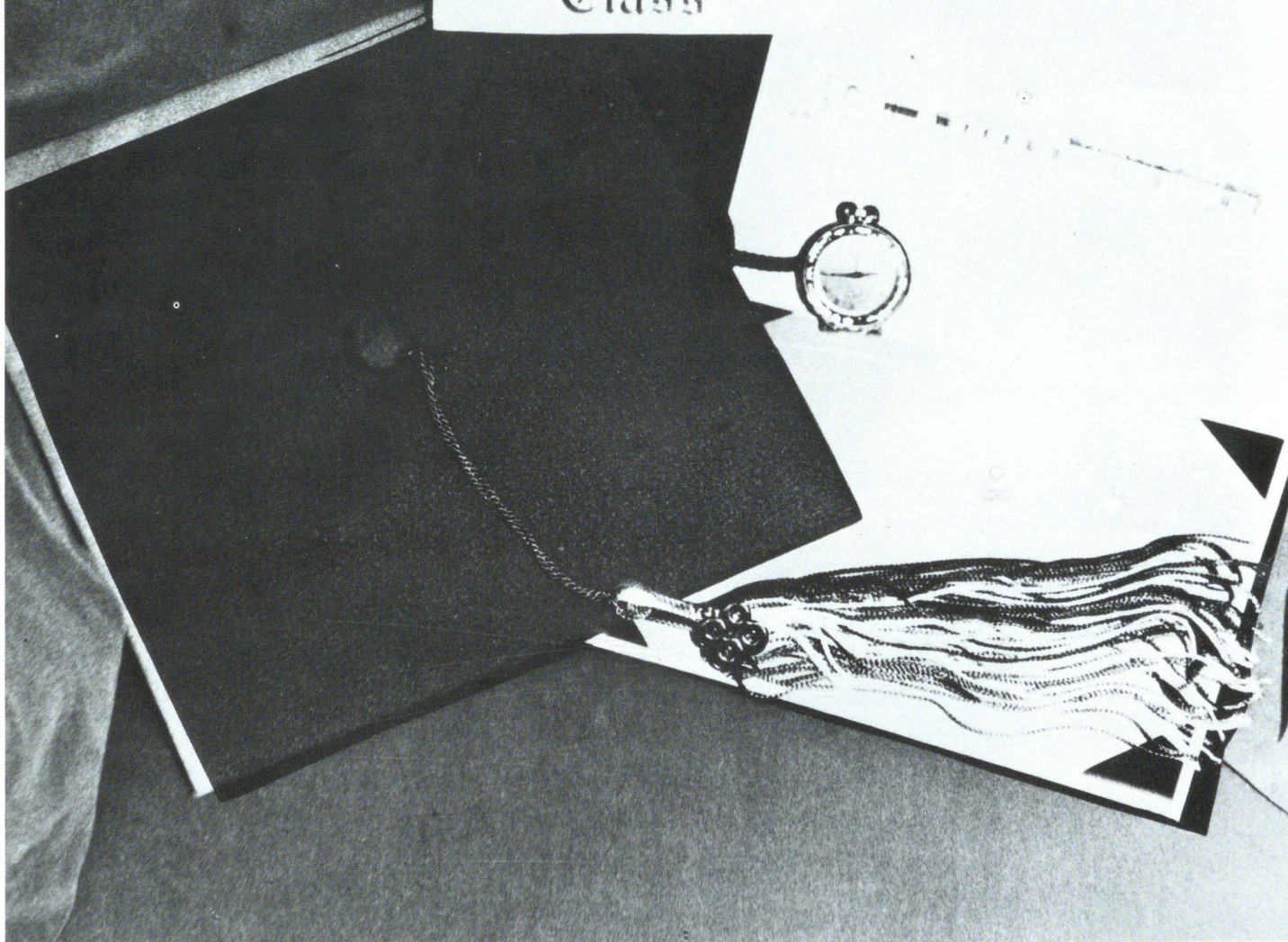

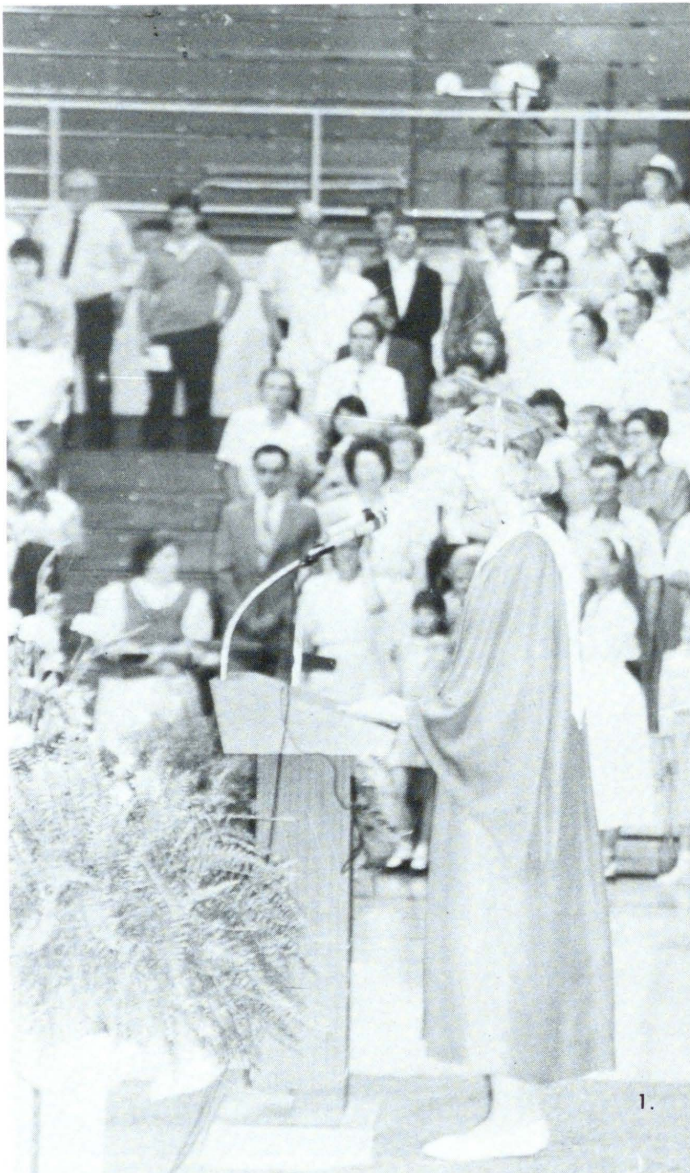
## FUNNY, HOW TIME SLIPS AWAY

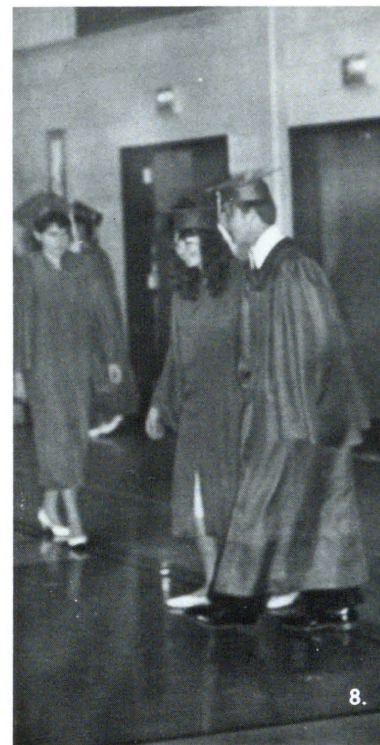
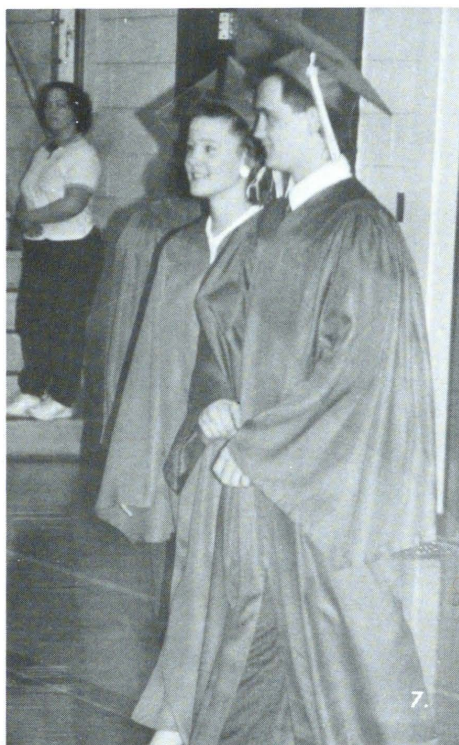
On May 20 the Commencement ceremony took place. Margaret White, class valedictorian gave the opening address. "Maybe Someday," the class song, was sung by

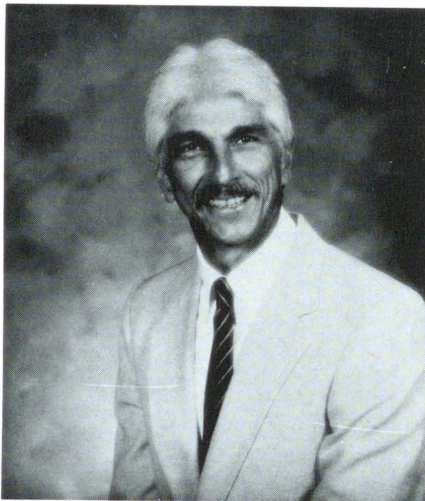
Chris Dean, as athletic director, is in charge of the entire athletic department. He schedules games throughout the year in all the

This year's track team was heavily supported by numerous underclassmen who showed great promise and will make a great contribution to next year's track team with the experience that they've gained this year.

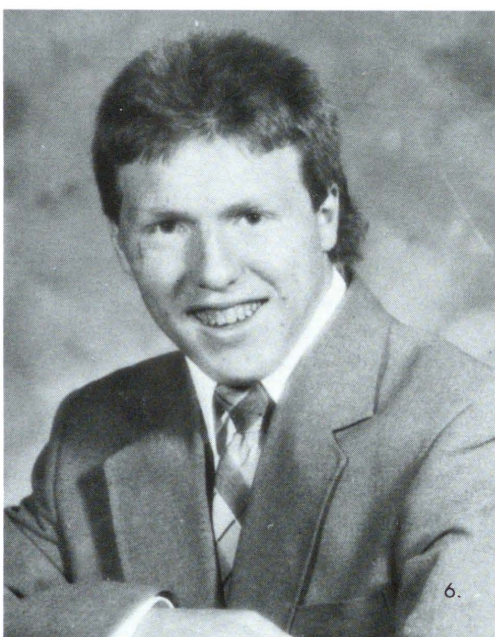
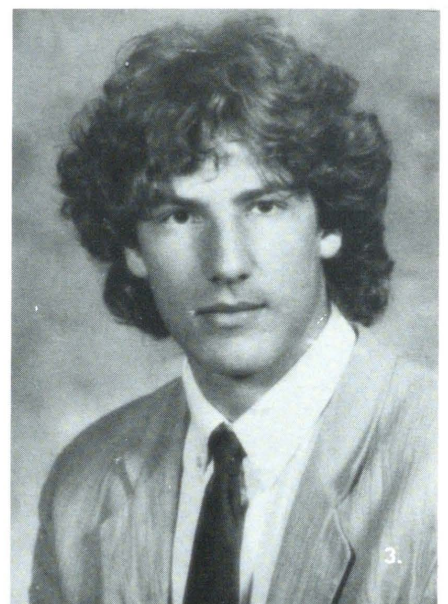
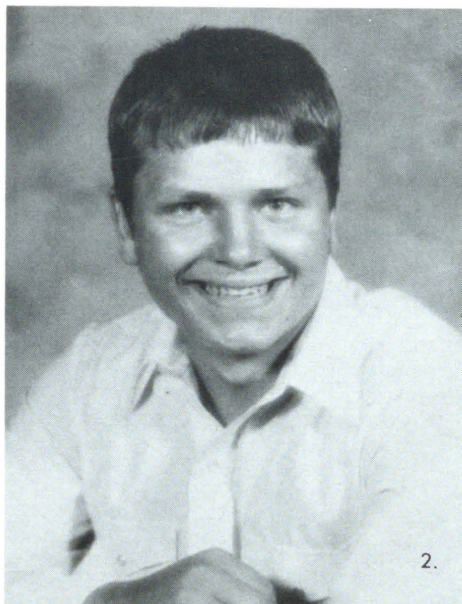
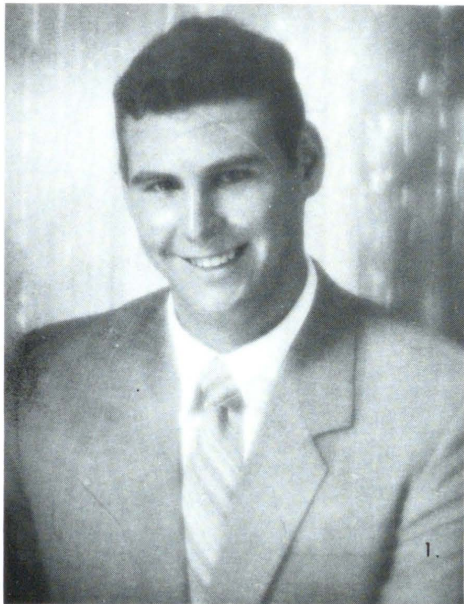

Photography is turned into a lifetime hobby once the "shutter bug" bites.

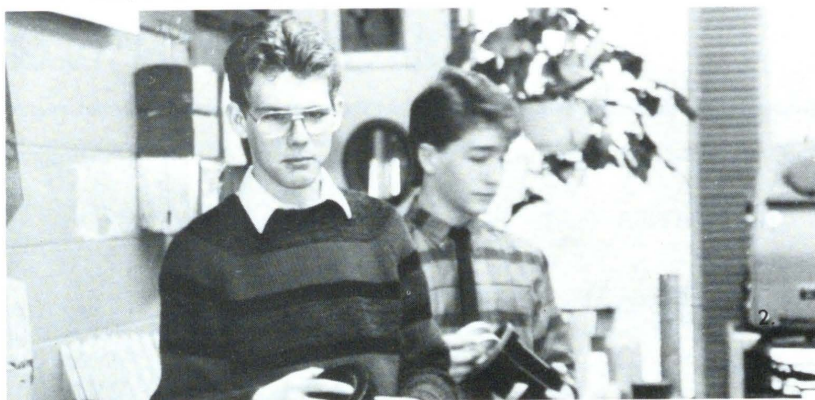

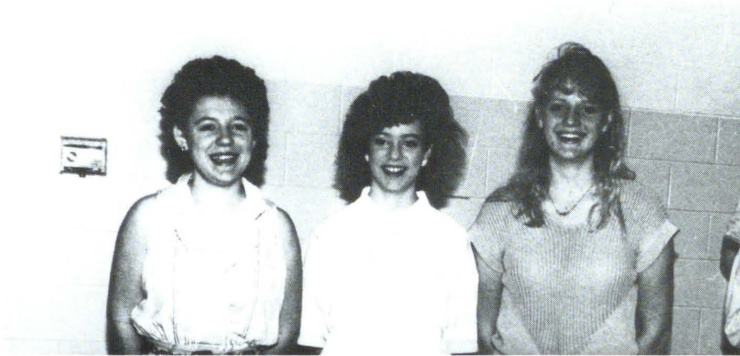
# PATRIOT SINGERS

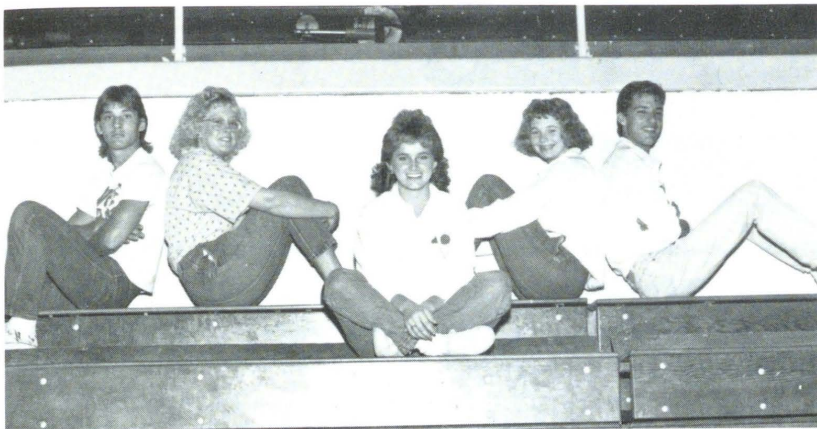

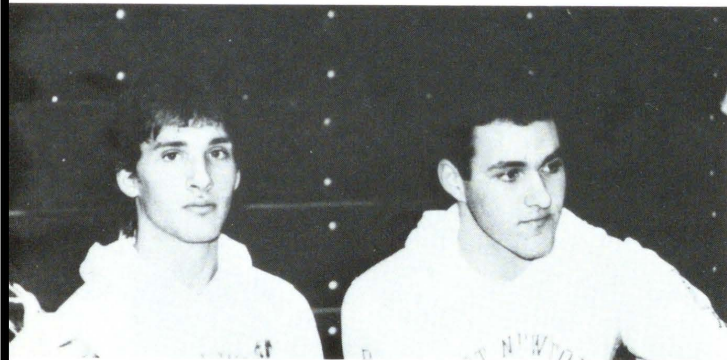

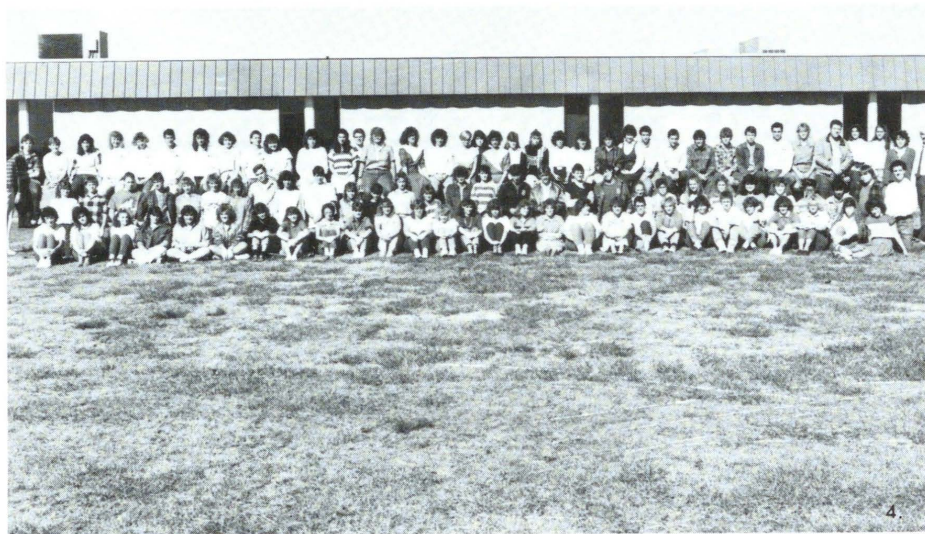
# S.O.D.A.

We are looking forward to a great year again next year.

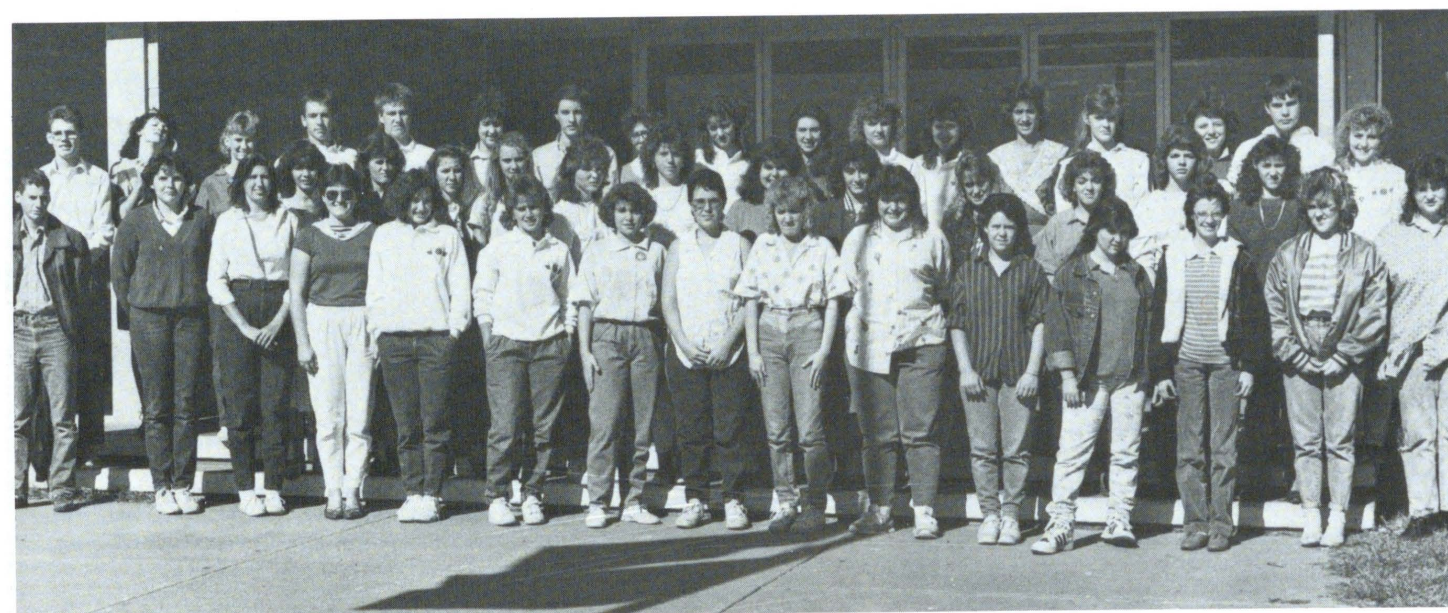

Junior, Tammy Boles was crowned Barnwarming Queen in November. The BOAC project was resurfacing an old basketball court



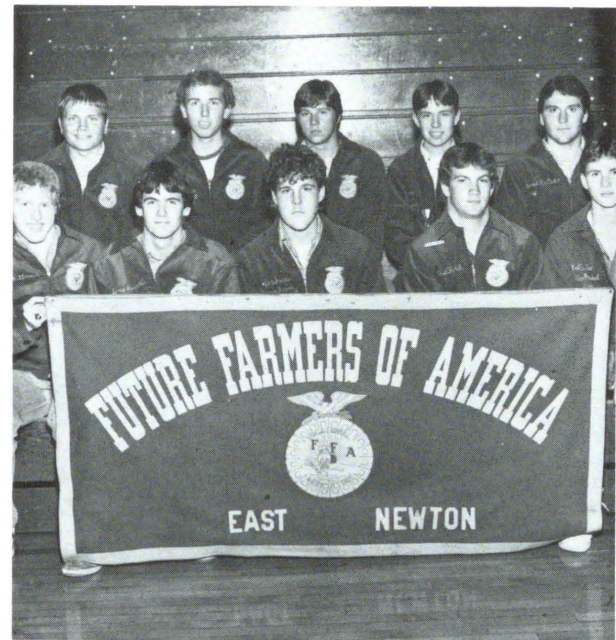

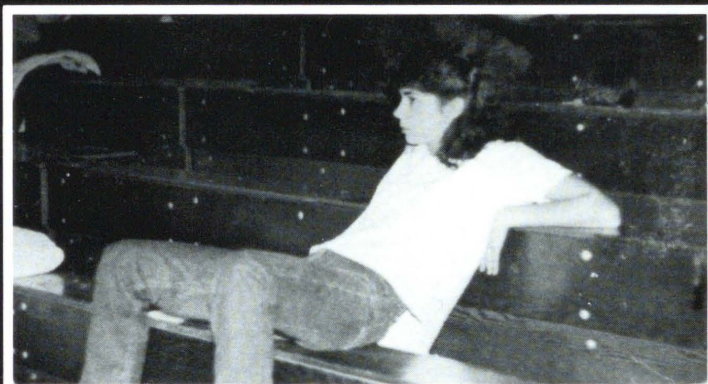
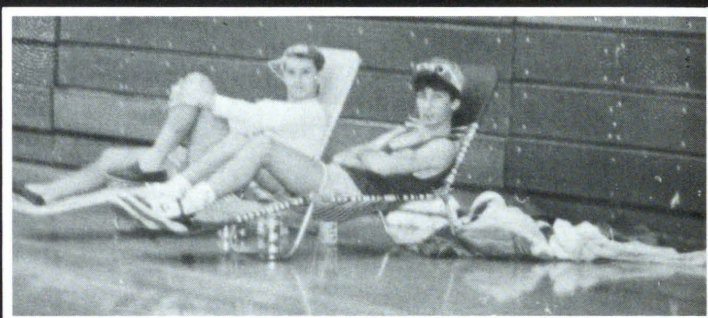




# 1988 TO SAY GOODBYE
