FOOTBALL HOMECOMING TIME FOR DREAMING




COUNTRY TIME


FUNNY, HOW TIME SLIPS AWAY


Chris Dean, as athletic director, is in charge of the entire athletic department. He schedules games throughout the year in all the



sports and arranges for referees for home events.


Jack Andris, as administrative assistant, is under the direct supervision of the superintendent. He is in charge of evaluating certain aspects of our special education programs.




tering information into the computer.





The Patriots began the season with one of the smallest and youngest teams in its history. With only 8 returning lettermen, it was easy to see that experience was badly




needed. The experience could only come for practice and actual game time. Even though the Pats got off to a rough start, by the time they played their last few games, they were finally playing as a team.

Although the Patriot football team won only 2 out of 10 games this year, they kept their pride and determination throughout the entire season. The enthusiasm of the team was marred by none.



























Although the season did not prevail, the team learned a great deal about the game. The coaching staff and fans are proud of the team because they never showed any signs of giving up.







East Newton is very proud of the effort shown by the girls and Coach Gibbons. We look forward to the coming season!






LIFE AND SPIRIT OF TIME

This years 1987-1988 Photography Staff was made up of all nine new photographers. Two members were also part of the yearbook staff.


Along with learning camera skills, the members also learn how to develop and print pictures. The photography staff works very closely with yearbook during the school year. The photographers



We are looking forward to a great year again next year.






















FOREIGN EXCHANGE STUDENTS
